Job Purpose

To carry out direct work and offer appropriate services to children and young people aged 5 – 18 years.

Job Responsibilities

1. To deliver age-appropriate group work sessions to children and young people and, where appropriate / necessary, provide 1:1 additional support.
2. To liaise with SWACA team colleagues in the identification of appropriate attendees for group work sessions.
3. To provide support needed to the child and to refer to other relevant support services as appropriate e.g. with regards to Safeguarding children.
4. To ensure at all stages that the child's needs are a priority and are responded to with understanding.
5. To ensure that accurate case files are maintained which include personal plans and ongoing evaluation.
6. To ensure that outcomes are identified and met and can be demonstrated to the referral agency, parent/carer, school and funding provider.
7. To advocate and liaise on behalf of the child with statutory and other agencies, should this be required.
8. To act in a consultancy/advisory capacity for external agencies.
9. To include children in consultation to help develop appropriate services.
10. To attend staff meetings, training, supervision and Board meetings as required.
11. Other reasonably similar duties may be allocated from time to time, appropriate to the general character of the post.
12. To supervise, support and monitor the performance of volunteers and students.
13. To promote the interests of the Charity by supporting fundraising and public relation events.
14. It is a requirement of the post that some evening and weekend work is undertaken for which time in lieu will be authorised.
